

## More On Sights, Mounts

**THE SCORES FROM THE** moving-target event are playing a decisive role in deciding the winner; thus, gaining any advantage in this stage is a prime consideration.

In the event, the shooter must engage a target moving right to left and left to right at 10, 15, 20, and 25 yards. This means the shooter must lead the target and know how far to hold in front of the X ring at all four distances, and holding off center will always be inexact to a degree.

To allow a dead-on hold when shooting the mover, Gilmore Concepts has introduced a lead compensating red-dot scope at \$300, and Power Custom makes an adjustable left and right indexing mount for \$250 plus installation. Advantages: The Power Custom mount allows use of a variety of scopes if you care to experiment or change scopes, and the Gilmore offering gives you less weight and bulk, allowing the sight to sit closer to the boreline of the revolver. Though both are good products, I would choose the Ron Power mount due its flexibility in mounting a variety of optics.
