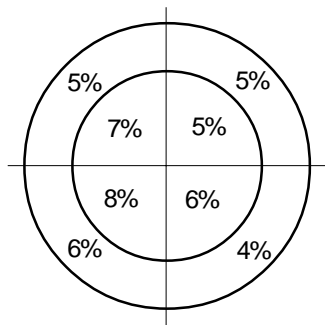

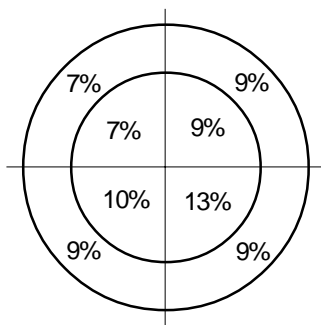

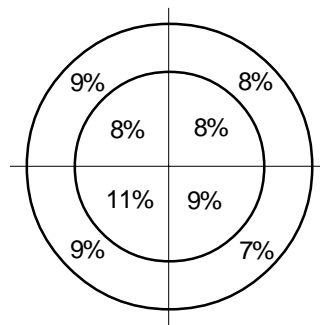
Patterning Results



Browning Modified Choke
Federal 2 ³/₄-in. Steel #4s
Shot in 20-in. Circle = 26%
Shot in 30-in. Circle = 20%
Total Shot in Pattern = 46%



Browning Modified Choke
Winchester 3-in. Steel #2s
Shot in 20-in. Circle = 39%
Shot in 30-in. Circle = 34%
Total Shot in Pattern = 73%



Browning Full Choke
Winchester 2 ³/₄-in. Lead #8s
Shot in 20-in. Circle = 36%
Shot in 30-in. Circle = 33%
Total Shot in Pattern = 69%

In our 40-yard patterning tests, the outer ring measured 30 inches in diameter. The inner 20-inch ring measured the core of the pattern. What we found: Both guns threw lighter patterns with steel than we expected, especially Federal's 2 ³/₄-inch steel load. Browning's Full choke delivered 69% of the lead shot inside a 30-inch circle at 40 yards. Shotshell guidelines suggest using less choke to get full-choke patterns with steel. The Modified tube produced 73% efficiency with #2 shot but a paltry 46% with #4s—less than half the shot was in the pattern.
