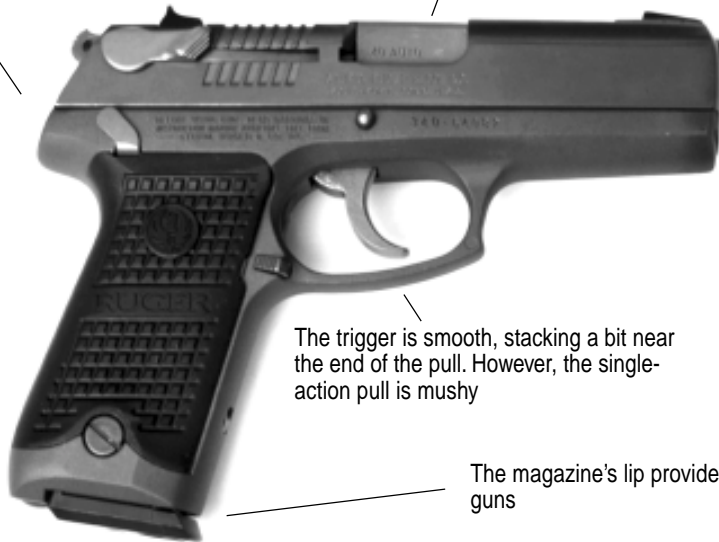


## RUGER P94DC

A safety stop keeps the hand away from the slide

The slide release wasn't as stiff as the other guns

The Ruger showed the highest bullet velocities, a likely result of its 4-inch barrel



This gun, while still compact, was the largest of the trio at 7.5 inches in overall length and 34 ounces of weight

The trigger is smooth, stacking a bit near the end of the pull. However, the single-action pull is mushy

The magazine's lip provides less support than the other guns
