Accuracy was suitable for a defensive handgun: just under 3 inches at 25 yards

The low-profile rear sight didn't snag clothing

The small aluminum-alloy frame is light and makes this the most "carryable" gun in the test

The small size of the Tactical's grip caused problems for large-handed shooters

Double-action trigger-pull weight is heavy and needs adjustment, we think

A lip on the magazine gives the pinkie finger a place to rest
