

HIGH-FREQUENCY TEST

Humans can't hear a wide enough sound spectrum to judge a call's frequency without a spectrogram, but there is a simple, crude test to see if a call is reaching high frequencies. If the call is starting to bother your ears in a closed room, it's probably high pitched. It is going past your upper hearing register and pegging your needle.

Applying this test to the Super Aluminator, we noticed the device hurts the ears when used outside—especially a hunter sitting to the side of the caller.
