While we essentially evaluated this handgun for self-defense, be assured it would be ideal for all target shooting where finest accuracy is required. Both the Baer and Volkmann would serve the NRA bull's-eye shooter better than the Wilson CQB because of their adjustable sights. We liked it a lot, but felt the extra cost of deburring, adding night sights, and its special finish were somewhat unjustified. We'd buy either the standard Premier II or the Baer Thunder Ranch Special at \$1990.
