The Ruger's bolt did not stay open following the last shot, though it could be locked open with a rocking lever in front of the trigger guard. There were



four holes drilled and tapped into the top of the receiver, but no tip-off rails.

The pistol grip and forend were strongly checkered. The camo coating covered just about everything, and was also very attractive, we thought. The rear sight was a folding one giving a sight picture we didn't much like.

There are many accessories available for the 10/22, perhaps none so clever as this laser sight. A button on the left of the stock activates it. Two tiny Allen screws permit adjusting it for elevation and windage to match your iron sights. This could be a handy item for dim-light conditions, as long as you can clearly identify your target.
