Perhaps the toughest bit of machining was to form a rib onto the curved top of the

Commander's slide. There is a cut on each side, beginning just in front of the rear sight, extending forward. There is a flat on top, with cuts that don't go all the way across, but instead form a cross-hatched area up the middle of the slide. There are no machining marks evident anywhere.

Right: We found a major problem with the rear sight in that it was razor-sharp. The customer specified this type sight, which he ended up not liking. It's easy to cycle the slide with one hand, using a sight of this type to catch on any suitable surface.
