To collect accuracy data, we fired three-shot groups from a rest at 25 yards. To capture velocity data, we used an Oehler 35P chronograph with the first skyscreen 10 feet from the muzzle.

Notes: The data above don't reflect the cost of shooting these products, which run somewhere between \$1 and \$3 a shot. For instance, the Winchester 400-grain platinum-tip hollowpoints (PTHP, No. 361538) cost \$40.49 for 20 rounds, or \$2.02 cents a round before taxes. The Cor-Bon 275-grain XPB HT500SW275 cost \$37.05 for 12 rounds, and the 325-grain XPB HT500W325 costs \$38.53 for 12 rounds, or \$3.09 a shot and \$3.21 a shot, respectively. Our handloads cost much less, of course. They were made with Winchester Unprimed .500 S&W Brass (WSC500SWU [50] 468694, \$27.99; Winchester Large Pistol Primer #7 (box of 1000, No. 619596), \$18.99; Hodgdon Titegroup Smokeless Powder, 1 pound of HTG1 from Midway USA No. 411636 costs \$14.39; and Barnes X 275-grain XPB 50025 479370 run \$18.99 for 20 bullets. — Kevin Winkle
