Very smooth and much quicker than either the Franchi or Stoeger, the action of the gas-operated Remington was favored by our test team. There were no malfunctions.



Slightly larger than the other shotguns in the test, this forearm was comfortable in the hand and allowed for easy gun movement.



This area is probably where the biggest difference in "gun feel" is experienced, and the Remington received top marks.

Plain, simple and time-tested, the stock fit was good for our test team and the recoil of the gas-operated shotgun was less than either of the other test models.



Slightly more complicated than the other two test guns because of its gas-operated system, the Remington was still easy to clean and allowed good access to the internal workings of the receiver.



More chokes would have been appreciated, although the three included in the package are fairly standard for most manufacturers. The modified choke produced a nearly perfect 50-50 pattern at 30 yards, performing target-breaking duties in fine fashion.
