

## HOW SHARP ARE THEY?

After the draw-and-fire testing was done, our shooters had a good impression of how easily the gun sights presented. We took the additional step of testing for sharp edges that our hands, holsters, or clothing might not find: We took a nylon stocking and ran it over the sights. There are three possible results listed in the table below: “Shredded” means that either the front or rear sight tore the stocking. “Snagged” means a sight momentarily caught the material. “Smooth” means the stocking flowed over the sights without a problem.
